Good news: The SAT[®] is coming to your high school. All 11th graders attending Colorado public schools will take it for free on April 14, 2020.

Why is that good news? The SAT is a globally recognized college entrance exam that measures the skills and knowledge that matter most for college and career success.

SAT PREPARATION

The SAT measures what you're learning in high school and what you need to succeed in college.

The best way to prepare for the SAT is to work hard in school.

- Take challenging courses
- Study for tests and quizzes
- Do your homework
- Ask and answer lots of questions in class

TEST SECTIONS

▪ EVIDENCE-BASED READING AND WRITING

- ◆ Reading Test
- ◆ Writing and Language Test

▪ MATH

▪ OPTIONAL ESSAY

- ◆ You can take the SAT Essay at no additional cost.
- ◆ The SAT Essay will be given as part of the school day administration, in separate SAT and SAT with Essay testing rooms.
- ◆ The SAT with Essay will take approximately one hour longer than the SAT.
- ◆ You can decide whether or not to take the SAT Essay, but you must add it to your registration by February 18, 2020. Changes to add or remove the essay after this date will not be allowed.

The vocabulary is closer to what you can expect to see in college classes.

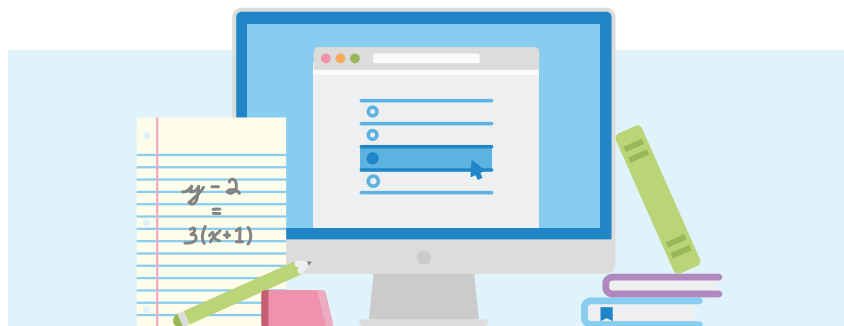


ESSENTIAL MATH
